

WASTE DISPOSAL



PAPER

What belongs in the paper bin /container?

- **Paper** (e.g. newspapers, magazines, paper packaging, writing paper and envelopes)
- **Cardboard** (e.g. cardboard boxes, even if these have the Green Dot mark printed on them)
- **Cardboard packaging** (e.g. cartons and corrugated cardboard)

The following should NOT be put in the paper bin / container, e.g.:

Cartons for milk, juice and other drinks →	Where? →	Yellow bin
Heavily soiled paper, wallpaper waste →	Where? →	General waste bin



GLASS

What belongs in the glass container?

- **Bottles**
- **Glasses**

The following should NOT be put into the glass container, e.g.:

Window glass (small quantities) →	Where? →	General waste bin
Light bulbs →	Where? →	General waste bin
Fluorescent tubes and energy saving bulbs →	Where? →	Hazardous waste collection point
Porcelain, pottery (small quantities) →	Where? →	General waste bin
Glass blocks, tiles →	Where? →	Recycling depot



PACKAGING

What should be put in the yellow bag and the yellow bin?

- **Plastic packaging** (e.g. yoghurt pots, detergent bottles, plastic foil, plastic bags)
- **Composite packaging** (e.g. beverage cartons for milk and juice)
- **Tinplate packaging** (e.g. cans and bottle tops)
- **Aluminium packaging** (e.g. yoghurt pot lids, airtight packaging for coffee)
- **Styrofoam packaging** (e.g. trays, padding material, transport protection for goods)

The following should NOT be put in the yellow bag or yellow bin, e.g.:

Cardboard and paper packaging →	Where? →	Paper bin / -container
Packaging made from glass →	Where? →	Glass container
Heavily soiled packaging →	Where? →	General waste bin
Packaging with large quantities of residue →	Where? →	General waste bin
Plastics and metals which are not packaging →	Where? →	General waste bin/Recycling
